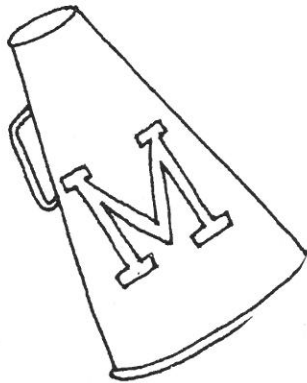

Marblehead High's football team had easy work in defeating the Newburyport team at Newburyport yesterday afternoon by a score of 27-3. The Headers plowed through the Newburyport line and scored in the first three quarters with ease. Practically the entire second team finished the game for Marblehead. Coach Jones' boys started the fireworks by scoring a touchdown before the first three minutes were up. Before the quarter was over, Marblehead scored a second touchdown, walking down the field with the ball with practically no opposition.

The second quarter was only a repetition of the first, only the Marblehead boys eased up and crossed the Newburyport line but once. Again in the third quarter, with half of the second team on the field, Coach Jones' boys scored another touchdown. Following this the rest of the second team was sent in. With a little less pounding coming their way, the Newburyport boys brought the ball to Marblehead's 20 yard line where they made their only score against their rivals by a pretty field goal kicked by Kezer.

This was the nearest that the Newburyport eleven came to the Marblehead goal line in the whole game. With the second team on the field, Marblehead kept the ball in Newburyport's territory for the rest

of the game, although they did no more scoring.

Snow and Giles starred in the Marblehead backfield while the whole line was alert opening plenty of holes for the backfield to pass through.
