Takes a Look at Things

HE'S a perpetual optimist is Curly Lambeau.

Most of the coaches in the National football league feel they will be extremely lucky if they have one or two boys around from the list of 30 each drafted a week ago. They set a figure of 5%.

But not Lambeau. Lambeau, frankly optimistic, feels that he will have some seven or eight of the boys he drafted for the Green Bay Packers come September. He feels that 25% is a figure nearer what he will have than 5%.

"We drew a larger number of married men than ever before," he explained. "The army is going to take most of the boys, sure, but I can't make myself believe it is going to take all of them in the next six months. I figure we're going to have seven or eight of those we drafted."

Lambeau's optimism in the face of the manpower demands, which he knows are coming, is rather strange, for a year ago, off a draft list of 20, he got exactly one boy, Bob Ingalls.
