

# Buckley among five who will enter M'head hall

The Marblehead Magicians Gridiron Club will hold its annual Hall of Fame dinner Saturday, Oct. 5, at the Gerry 5 club. Five former Marblehead football players will be inducted. The evening begins with a social hour at 6 p.m., dinner at 7 p.m. and the program at 8 p.m.

Those earning a spot in the hall this year include Charles "Dubbie" Bartlett (1926-1929). Bartlett was a four-year starter at left guard and left tackle. He played under coach Marshall Shearer (5-3-2) in 1926 and under coach Stan Burnham the following three years (6-3-1), (5-5-1) and 4-2-3).

Bob Martin (1949-1951) played quarterback and halfback under Coach Herm Hussey in 1949, 1950 and 1951. Martin played a minor role for the 1949 (7-2) Northeastern Conference co-champions as a sophomore. He played a key role, alternating at quarterback and halfback for the 1950 (8-1-1) conference champions. He was the offensive star of the 1951 team and was also a good punter.

Martin ran for seven touchdowns and passed for seven. He had 20 runs of more than 35 yards. A full-time defensive halfback, two of his touchdowns came on 55-yard and 77-yard touchdown interception runs. In his final game, a 19-7 win over Swampscott, he ran 35 yards and caught two TD passes, accounting for all three scores. He set all-time rushing and scoring records at Bates College and was voted into its

Hall of Fame.

Don Jermyn (1961-1963) played three years for coach Noel Reebenacker. An all-around player, Jermyn was a triple threat — running, passing and kicking for 87 points in his high school career. He was also a talented defensive player.

Jermyn was a major factor for the 1962 Northeastern Conference champs (6-2-1), alternating at quarterback with Daynor Prince and as a running back scoring three touchdowns and passing for five. He scored 53 points as a senior for the 7-2 Magicians with eight touchdowns. He also passed for four touchdowns.

Brian Buckley (1972-1974) was one of Marblehead's top quarterbacks under coach Alex Kulevich.

A part-time performer as a sophomore in 1972 (5-4), Buckley led Marblehead to a 7-2 record in 1973 and a share of

the Northeastern Conference title with 16 touchdown passes, eight to Bill Sahagian. He scored two touchdowns, kicked 11 PATs and recorded a two-point conversion.

Buckley was directly involved in 121 of the team's 195 points. His career highlight was Thanksgiving Day when he engineered a 20-12 upset of Swampscott with 18 pass completions in 21 attempts for 231 yards and one touchdown. It was Swampscott's first conference loss in seven years.

Buckley starred as quarterback for Exeter and Harvard.

Tom Kulevich (1978-1980) played three years at linebacker and tight end for Marblehead under his father, coach Alex Kulevich. He became a dominant defensive player in his junior and senior years as a middle linebacker.

Kulevich was also a blocking and running tight end and kicked seven PATs in 1979. He scored three touchdowns, the last on a 41-yard tight-end screen with less than a minute to play to beat Winthrop 13-8, a major upset at the time. Kulevich was on several all-star teams and was the winner of the 1980 Item Player of the Year award (then the Thom McAn).
